



ON PROFESSIONAL ETHICS

The journal *The Medical and Ecological Problems* requires all authors and reviewers to disclose any conflicts of interest that may exist when submitting a manuscript for publication. A conflict of interest arises if the activities of the participants in the publication process (financial ties, personal relationships, competition in the intellectual and scientific spheres, etc.) unacceptably influence their decisions.

When submitting a manuscript, authors are responsible for acknowledging and disclosing information about financial and other conflicts of interest that could affect their work. External reviewers should notify the editors of any factors that may bias their evaluation and, in this regard, decline consideration of specific manuscripts. Reviewers do not have the right to use the materials of the reviewed scientific works to achieve their own interests until the moment of their publication.

According to the Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals, as an integral part of the publication process, authors, reviewers and editors must report any conflicts of interest and provide detailed information by signing a standard application form and sending it to the journal editorial office.
