

## STATEMENT OF INFORMED CONSENT

The journal *The Medical and Ecological Problems* adheres to the Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals. The authors of the articles will respect the patient's right to privacy. Any identifying information – such as names, initials, etc. – should not be published, unless written informed consent is given and the content is essential for the scientific purpose and merit of the manuscript. Informed consent requires

that a patient who is identifiable be shown a manuscript to be published. Failure to obtain the informed consent of the patient before submission would result in manuscript rejection.

The patient must be thoroughly informed of the purposes of the research, of the expected period of participation, as well as of the procedures to be performed and which, if any, are experiments. Reasonably foreseeable risks, discomforts, and expected benefits must be announced. Participation is voluntary, refusal will not be penalized, and participation may cease at any time without penalty.

Upon familiarization with the above-mentioned details, the patient must complete the standard statement form "I undersign that I have read the information provided above. I voluntarily agree to participate in this study".
