



STATEMENT OF INFORMED CONSENT

Journal *The Medical and Ecological Problems* adheres to the Uniform Requirements for Manuscripts Submitted to Biomedical Journals. The authors of the articles will respect the patients' right to privacy. Any identifying information – such as names, initials etc. – should not be published in written material or photographs, unless written informed consent is given and the content is essential for the scientific purpose and merit of the manuscript. Informed consent requires that a patient who is identifiable be shown the manuscript to be published. Failure to obtain informed consent of patient prior to submission would result in manuscript rejection.

The patient must be thoroughly informed of the purposes of the research, of the expected time period of participation, as well as of the procedures to be performed and which, if any, are experimental. Reasonably foreseeable risks, discomforts and expected benefits must be announced. The participation is voluntary, refusal will not be penalized, and participation may cease at any time without penalty.

Upon the familiarization with the abovementioned details, the patient must complete the standard statement form: “I undersign that I have read the information provided above. I voluntarily agree to participate in this study”.
